The Hidden Costs of Privatizing Housing

1. Communities lose both publicly owned owned affordable housing units <u>and</u> the land on which they once sat.

2. Private developers and landlords also profit from generous tax credits, public subsidies, and public financing—<u>all</u> funded with taxpayer dollars.


